FACULTY OF ARTS

The regular bimonthly meeting of the Faculty of Arts was held on Thursday, October 3, 1963. There were 38 members present. The minutes of the last regular meeting and of the special meeting held on April 24, 1963 were read and declared approved by the dean.

Elections were then held for representatives to the Committee on Studies and to the University Council. Mr. Walter Kontak was elected to the Committee on Studies for three years. Rev. Gregory MacKinnon and Dr. Edward Monahan were elected to the University Council for the academic year 1963-64.

Rev. D. F. Campbell mentioned that a letter had been received from the Deputy Minister of Education and had been discussed by the University Council. The letter asked that if Grade XII became the college entrance requirement would the pass B.A. and B. Comm. be of three or four years duration. He also said that this matter would be further discussed at the October regular meeting of the University Faculty.

Mr. John Sears asked that the minutes of the two meetings dealing with the Honors Program be mimeographed and circulated to the members of the Faculty along with the two reports on the Honors program. Request granted.

Dr. Desmond Connor raised a problem created by the fact that the girls were not able to use the university library in the evenings. He was referring to two students in particular. Sister Saint Michael said that arrangements had been made for these students. Dr. Woodfine mentioned that the same difficulty existed in other classes where students had to prepare essays. Sister Saint Francesca again brought up the possibility of lending one or two copies of certain books to the Mount Saint Bernard library for the use of the girls. This question was referred to the Library Committee.

The dean then appointed Father Ginivan, Dr. Monahan and Mr. Doiron to the Agenda Committee. Mr. Babin was nominated as secretary of the Faculty for another year.

Meeting adjourned.
